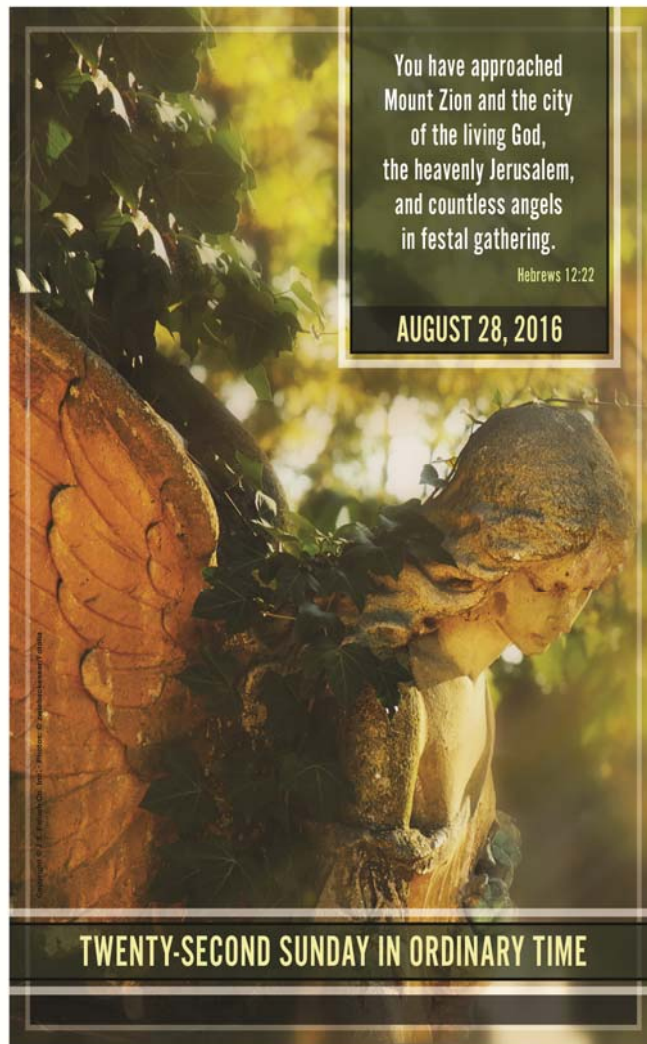

A NEW WEEK — FR. JOHN VIEN

Back to School! For so many in our parish, that is what has been happening over the last few weeks. Many of our parishioners have set off to college and I know that many of their parents have also made the trek to help them get settled. Our high school students are back to class both at our wonderful Catholic high schools and our excellent public schools. Our Mary, Queen of Peace Parish School began on August 17 with 393 students from Pre-School through 8th Grade. And our Mary, Queen of Peace Parish School of Religion began this past August 23. Let us remember and pray for our young people in school and for their teachers and catechists, that they might grow in knowledge, wisdom, and charity this year, according to God's plan.

I'm grateful to all our parishioners who support our Parish School and our Parish School of Religion, first and foremost by bringing your children here for their religious education. The Church teaches that parents are the primary educators of their children in the ways of faith, and the Church assists parents by offering quality Catholic education. Sending your children to our Parish School or our Parish School of Religion is a sacrifice, I know – a financial sacrifice, certainly, but also a sacrifice of your time and energies. I believe that the efforts of parents to educate their children in the Catholic faith will bear much fruit in the years to come, and I want to encourage you and tell you that your sacrifices of time and money are worth it. Thanks to all the parents of our young people who are giving them the gift of a Catholic education!

The number of students in our parish school – and most every Catholic school – has decreased in the last number of years. That is no secret, and there is no one easy explanation for this. Certainly cost is a factor, including the salary and benefits offered to our lay teachers, but so is the quality of our public schools and the secularized society in which we live. Some of those factors are difficult to address, but the cost of Catholic Education is something that I hope will be easier for parents and families in the years to come, especially because of the scholarships offered by the *Beyond Sunday* campaign. *Beyond Sunday*, which is underway in our parish, is an Archdiocesan campaign seeking to raise \$100 million to endow scholarships especially for middle-income families. I hope that many parents in our parish will apply for these scholarships in the years to come. Some good news is that four MQP families received *Beyond Sunday* scholarships for our parish school already this year, and another two families received scholarships for our Catholic high schools. This Fall, everyone in our parish will be asked to make a pledge to *Beyond Sunday* and I encourage you to be generous in your giving.

Learning and growing in faith is a lifelong process, so back to school time should have all of us thinking about how we can continue to learn and grow. I am so pleased that our parish offers so many Adult Faith formation opportunities, and I want to encourage you to consider taking just one step to grow in your faith this year. Perhaps you could attend Alpha, a simple exploration of Christianity in a non-threatening atmosphere. Our Marriage Ministry is starting soon, so husbands and wives can come together for a Date Night to grow in faith and love. MOPS (Mothers of Pre-Schoolers) offers wonderful faith formation and fellowship for our young mothers, and our Young Families group offers great opportunities for those not yet of school age and their parents. I hope that many of the men of our parish commit to attending the ACTS Retreat this Fall. How are you growing in faith as Fall begins?

This school year also brings a new resident to our Rectory. Please offer a warm welcome to Philip Rathinam, who is residing and ministering at MQP this school year. Philip is a third year seminarian from Kenrick Seminary studying for the Archdiocese of St. Louis. He is here this year on a Pastoral Internship to experience parish life and parish ministry in preparation for Ordination to the Diaconate and Priesthood. He will be present at parish meetings and functions, assist in our school and PSR and Youth Ministry, and of course will be present on Sundays as we celebrate the Eucharist. Please offer a warm welcome to Philip!
