

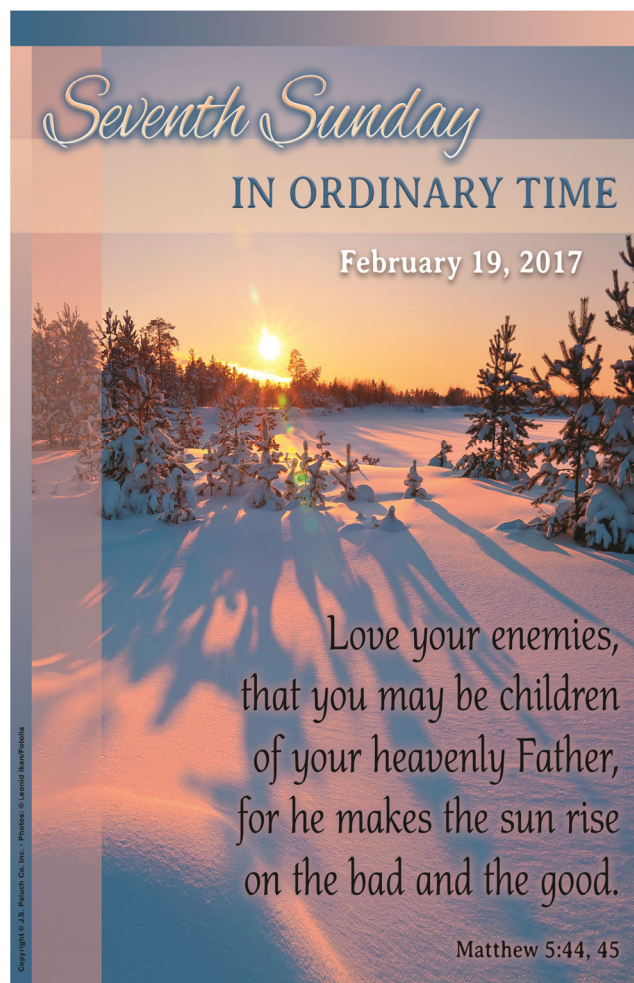

A NEW WEEK — FR. JOHN VIEN

It's with mixed emotions that I shared the news with the parish and the school this week that our School Principal, Amy Schroff, will be leaving Mary Queen of Peace at the end of the school year. Mrs. Schroff has been a strong, capable, and faithful leader of our school community for the last five years, and her departure will be felt strongly by so many students, parents, faculty, and parishioners. I have enjoyed working with Amy in this year that I have been here as Pastor, and I will miss her as a co-worker and friend.

Mrs. Schroff would have been happy to stay at Mary Queen of Peace for another year or two or five, if she had not felt the call to return to the school where she started as a teacher, St. Justin Martyr in Sunset Hills. She will return there next year as the School Principal, so it's a bit of a homecoming for her. I know she is sad about leaving MQP but excited about this new chapter of her career. We've told the students and faculty that there's still a long way to go before the end of the school year, so from here on out it's business as usual. Certainly there will be time at the end of the school year to give Mrs. Schroff a proper farewell, and we will do that, but for the next few months, it's all about reading, writing, and arithmetic (religion too!).

While I'm sad to see Amy go, I'm also excited about the prospect of hiring a new principal to lead MQP School for the years to come. We will follow all the guidelines of the Archdiocesan Catholic Education Office in selecting our new principal, which includes forming a Search Committee who will vet candidates, conduct interviews, and make a recommendation to me about who to hire. I've already received letters and resumes from interested candidates, and I believe that MQP is a school that many capable, qualified, and faithful administrators will want to lead. I hope that we can find a new Principal in the weeks and months to come, certainly by the end of the school year, but there is no hard and fast time frame. I'd ask all of you, our parish family, to pray for this intention in the weeks to come: that God will send us, and that we will recognize, the most qualified person to lead our school. Come, Holy Spirit!

I'm also sad to announce that our Director of Youth Ministry, Angela Fiordelisi, will also be leaving the MQP staff. Angela has directed our Youth Ministry program for five years, and so many of our children and families have been influenced and had their faith strengthened because of Life Teen Nights, Edge, Luke 18, the Steubenville Youth Conference, Project Life, and so many other activities that she has coordinated. Angela is to be commended and thanked for the great work that she has done, and for the deep and amazing faith that she has brought to this ministry.

I'm not sure about the future of our Youth Ministry program here. For all the good work that Angela did, the number of teens that participate (in a parish our size) should be more. So many of our high school students attend Catholic schools and are involved in so many activities that Church events aren't high on the list of priorities, sadly. Yet, we owe our teenagers the opportunity for faith formation and the chance to know and love Jesus Christ in the midst of their parish family. Angela worked here part-time. Do we hire another part-time Director, or hire someone full-time, and if we do that how do we pay for that position when we still have a parish deficit? Can we rely on parents or volunteers? Are there other staff positions that are more critical? I'll admit that after some months of prayer, I still don't know the answers to these questions, and I will continue to rely on the Pastor's Leadership Team and the Parish Council to give me wise counsel. I'm open to your thoughts and suggestions, of course, so be in touch with me if you have ideas to share. And keep this intention in your prayer as well: that we respond faithfully and effectively as a parish to the spiritual needs and faith formation of our teenagers.
