
We, the people of Mary Queen of Peace Church, are called by God to live in community as disciples.

A NEW WEEK — FR. JOHN VIEN

Chapter IV of St. Pope John Paul II's Apostolic Letter "Dies Domini" considers Sunday as the "**Dies Hominis**" or the "**Day of Humanity**." To make this point, the late Holy Father reflects on Sunday as a day of **joy, rest, and solidarity**.

Sunday is a day of joy! The late Pope writes, "*Sunday is the day of joy in a very special way... this joy should never be confused with shallow feelings of satisfaction or pleasure. In the Christian view, joy is much more enduring and consoling; as the saints attest, it can hold firm even in the dark night of suffering. It is, in a certain sense, a virtue to be nurtured.*" How do you, how do we, as a parish community, nurture this virtue of joy?

I have seen much joy here at Mary Queen of Peace; there is a warm sense of community, a deep love for the Church and for one's neighbor, and a great spirit of generosity and stewardship. But we must remain vigilant! It is easy to be depressed and anxious about the future of our country, our cities, our parish, our families; indeed, we all face many problems every day. But the Christian virtue of joy must always be nurtured, and our Sunday celebration, a little Easter, assures us that Christ has won the victory over evil and sin and death. We Christians must be joyful in the midst of difficulty, and Sunday reminds us of the cause of our joy.

Do you remember so many years ago when businesses were all closed on Sundays? I remember that nothing was open except the Quik Shop and an occasional restaurant! Nowadays, nearly every shop and restaurant is open for business on Sundays, so for those who work in the service industries, Sunday is hardly a day of rest, but is just another day of work. Pope John Paul II reminds us that Sunday is a day of rest: "*Through Sunday rest, daily concerns and tasks can find their proper perspective: The material things about which we worry give way to spiritual values; in a moment of encounter and less pressured exchange, we see the true face of the people with whom we live. Even the beauties of nature...can be rediscovered and enjoyed to the full.*" Does this Sunday rest mean that we can never work on Sundays? I think not; the origin of Sunday rest was to assure that Christians had the time to come together for Eucharist. If we take the time to come to Sunday Mass, other work can rightly be done; but on Sundays, Eucharist always comes first, before other work or pleasures.

Finally, our late Holy Father reminds us that Sunday is also a day of solidarity, giving the faithful an opportunity to devote themselves to works of mercy and charity. He goes on to say that on Sundays, Christians should "*look around to find people who may need their help. It may be that in their neighborhood or among those they know there are sick people, elderly people, children or immigrants, who precisely on Sunday feel more keenly their isolation, need and suffering.*" Sunday is a day for us to reach out to those who are in need! Freed from work and other pressures, Sunday is the premier day for us to visit sick relatives and friends in hospitals and nursing homes, help an elderly neighbor with housework or yard work, cook a meal for someone who is hungry, spend a few hours in volunteer work, or visit the grave of someone we love. As the late Pope says, "*These would certainly be ways of bringing into people's lives the love of Christ received at the eucharistic table.*"

Are you a person of joy, believing in the Easter promise? Do you take proper Sunday rest? Can you reach out in solidarity to those in need, especially on Sunday? Those are good questions for us on this Sunday, the "**Dies Hominis**."

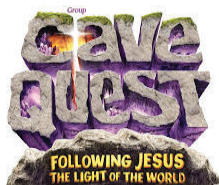
