

**A NEW WEEK — FR. JOHN VIEN**

Two Sundays ago, both Fr. Aaron and I preached about hospitality. Hospitality is one of the “3 H’s” that make up the Sunday Experience: Hymns, Homilies, and Hospitality. This has been the focus of the Pastor’s Leadership Team so far, and we are working on ways to improve our Sunday Experience by focusing on the 3 H’s. So that we can continue to grow as a community of hospitality and welcome, I’d like to share some excerpts from my homily two weeks ago:

*In the ancient world, hospitality was not just a point of etiquette; it was a requirement for survival. The world was a perilous place! There were no Holiday Inns or Schnucks or even rest stops. No, travelers depended on the goodwill of others for food, shelter, and necessary supplies while they were on a journey. It was understood that travelers must be welcomed and could never be exploited. In fact, some people believe that Divine beings roamed the earth in search of examples of human graciousness. In the letter to the Hebrews, we hear, “Do not neglect hospitality, for through it, some unknowingly entertained angels.”*

*In the Gospel, Jesus instructs his followers on the need for hospitality. He says, “Whoever receives you, receives me.” Which teaches us explicitly, that a guest is Christ. Jesus also says “whoever gives only a cup of cold water to one of these little ones to drink because the little one is a disciple, he will surely not lose his reward.” We might be tempted here to think that Jesus is talking about children when he refers to little ones, after all, Jesus does seem to have an affinity and love for children. But I’d like to expand that a bit. I like to believe that the little ones are all those misfits, odd ducks, strange and simple folks who find acceptance, love, compassion, and welcome in the Church. After all, we have a Church that is for everyone: for the rich and the poor, for black and white, for old and young, for the searching and the stranger, for the gay and the straight, for the disabled and the able bodied, for the prestigious and the lowly, for the immigrant and the prisoner, for those addicted and those abused. These are the lowly ones. You and I, in some ways, are the lowly ones. I know I am! Yes, this Church that we belong to and love is meant to be a place where all people belong as part of a bigger picture – a world not limited by provincial and polarizing views, but one which opens up to new possibilities, insights, and understandings. Welcome to strangers and hospitality to all is the first step.*

*Friends, all of us are called to be ministers of hospitality and welcome, especially here when we gather at the table of the Lord. How sad and unfortunate that anyone would walk into this Church, or any Church, and not feel welcome and valued. And yet, we all know it happens. Maybe it’s happened to you. You come here or there to Mass, no one says hello, no one smiles, people appear lifeless and bored. We can do so much better!*

*How wonderful that Fr. Aaron and some of our parishioners have revitalized our hospitality ministry! We now have greeters at each Mass, who are tasked with welcoming those who come here, assisting them as necessary, holding the door or even holding an umbrella. To all of you who are Hospitality Ministers, thank you for being the welcoming face of Jesus to our parish. If you’d like to assist in this ministry, it really doesn’t take more than a few minutes of being kind and gracious, so be in touch. But you know what? A Ministry of Hospitality is kind of a misnomer because every single person here is called to be a Minister of Hospitality. Not everyone is a priest, or a lector, or a server, but everyone in this Church is a minister of Hospitality. Everyone here is charged with knowing one another, welcoming one another, assisting one another, and so building up the Body of Christ.*

*That might mean offering more than a perfunctory hello at the beginning of Mass, but actually telling someone your name and remembering someone else’s name the next week you come to Mass.*

*Maybe it means looking around and noticing who you’ve never seen or you don’t know, seeking that person or that family out after Mass and welcoming them.*

*Maybe it means suggesting a stop at Starbucks or Dunkin’ Donuts to someone you always see or have always known, but just don’t get a chance to connect. At the very least it means that we smile and are kind, because as I’ve said often: there’s a lot more to being Christian than being kind, but if we’re not kind, we’re not Christian.*

*Once we get that hospitality, welcome, and love right here at the Eucharist... then it will naturally flow out from here to others – to our parish ministries and organizations, our neighborhood and community, to the poor, the vulnerable, and those most in need of a word of love and acceptance. That is a dream I have for Mary Queen of Peace – that people throughout St. Louis will know us for our hospitality & welcome and say, “That’s the kind of Church I want to be a part of!” Are you in?*

#### July 16 — The Word

Many of us have heard the jokes that Catholics don't read the Bible. While it is true that the sacramental life of the Catholic Church is wonderful and surpasses the power of Scripture alone, it is imperative for us to read and pray with Scripture. Jesus, the Word made flesh, reminds us in His words to the disciples how important it is to hear the Word of God, to meditate on it, and to implement its truths into our daily lives. He reminds us of the necessity to be rooted in it and to allow it to become the wellspring from which all of our thoughts, words, and actions flow. We should read Scripture every single day of our lives, whether that means going to daily Mass and listening to the readings, praying *lectio divina*, or praying a daily Bible verse on one of the various apps. St. Jerome once said that ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ. We come to a fuller knowledge and relationship with the Lord when we read the Scriptures.

South Central CYC is in need of Soccer Referees for the fall soccer season.

Requirements for NEW referees for this PAID position are as follows:

- You must be 14 years old by August 1, 2017.
- Attend classroom clinic on either Wednesday, July 19, or on Sunday, July 30, at Sacred Heart — Valley Park from 6—10 pm.
- Attend field training on Sat, Aug. 5, from 9—11 am at St. Gerard Majella.
- Bring Cash/Check/Credit Card in the amount of \$30 to purchase referee jersey/pealess whistle and lanyard/data wallet w/pad and red and yellow cards. The jersey only is \$20. 3-stripe referee socks will also be available for purchase.
- Receive a score of 92% or above on the 2017 Soccer Official's Test.
- Referees 18 years of age must meet additional archdiocesan requirements.

RETURNING referees must also receive a score of 92% or above on the 2017 Soccer Official's Test and are encouraged to attend a classroom clinic and on-field training. Classroom clinic is required for returning referees who score <92% on the official's test.

Pay ranges from \$16/game for K-1st grade games to \$20/game for 2nd-3rd grade games.
