

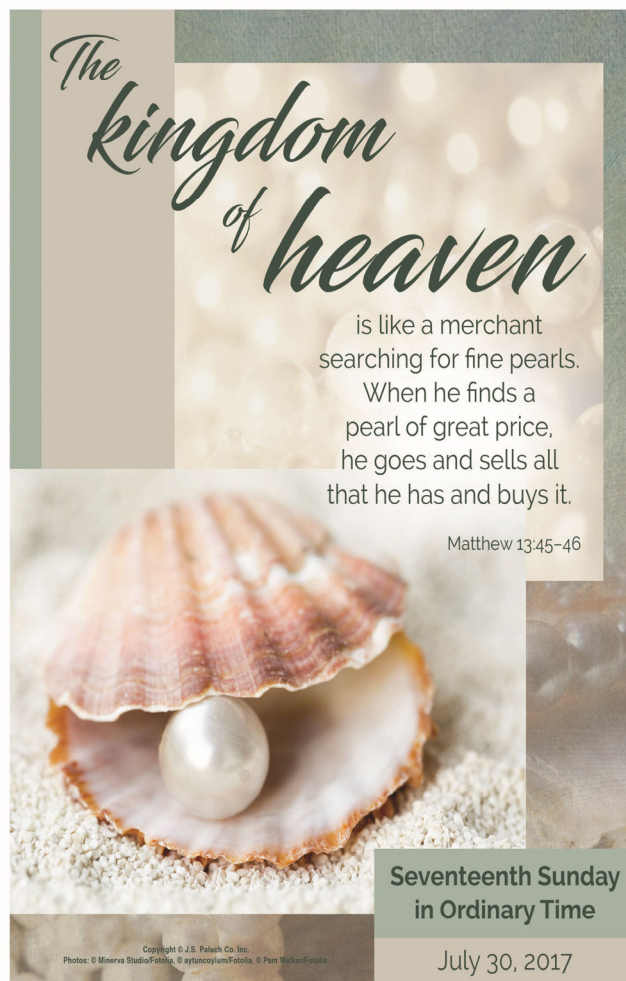

**A NEW WEEK — FR. JOHN VIEN**

*A few weeks ago, our bulletins did not arrive in time for Sunday, so many of you did not get to see my bulletin column that week. Here it is again!*

Summertime! It's my favorite time of year. Yes, I know that everyone loves Christmas, but give me summer over winter anytime! This is a time of year that brings a smile to the face of almost everyone. It is a time of year when children are freed from the responsibilities of school work, families and friends gather together for picnics and share a moment of love and friendship, and a time when fireflies light up the soft, warm summer evening skies. As we enjoy this summertime, I hope that everyone takes a few moments to reflect upon the meaning of this special God-given season and thank him for it.

Summer often acts like a Sabbath for the year. God created the world in six days, and rested on the seventh. Likewise, students and people in the work force work diligently through the year, and summertime provides a period of rest and refreshment after long hours of labor. Although work continues through the summer, many use this season to take a much-needed vacation with family and friends.

School is out for students, but they still continue to learn every day. As parents, who are the primary educators of their children, what lessons have you planned for your children this summer? May all of us emerge from this season more rested to do God's work, more committed to serve God's people, and more in love with our God who created and loves us!

## PROTECTING GOD'S CHILDREN WORKSHOP

Anyone who works with, or volunteers with, children thru the school or parish must be compliant with the Safe Environment Program of the Archdiocese of St. Louis set forth by the USCCB (US Conference of Catholic Bishops). Compliance includes attending a Protecting God's Children Workshop, completing a Worker Registration Form to obtain a background check, and reading and signing a Code of Ethical Conduct. Each location must have copies of individual background checks & code of ethics forms on file for all active volunteers and employees. Additional background checks may be necessary if you have lived out of state in previous years.
