



A NEW WEEK — FR. JOHN VIEN

While it would be nice only to deal with spiritual matters as your Pastor and as a Parish family, the truth is that practical matters take up so much of my time and so much of our efforts as a parish. Case in point: air conditioning. Those who attended certain 11am Masses on Sundays in June, or those who came to Mass during the week can testify that we had more than a few hot days inside our Church. Our HVAC contractors spent no little time diagnosing and repairing the AC, with the final repair being a new compressor to the tune of over \$10,000. This is a necessary expense, of course, and we'll make every effort to keep our Church and our parishioners cool or warm, as the case may be. (After all, it's tough to pray, even as a presider, when you're wearing about five layers of clothes and sweating through them all!) Thanks to Barb, our Business Manager, and Jim, our Maintenance Coordinator, for their good work getting us cool again, and to all our parishioners who sweated through a few hot Masses for their patience.

Another issue our staff had to deal with this week was regrettable and entirely unnecessary. Sometime over the weekend into Monday, graffiti was scrawled onto the outside gym wall back near the playground. I'm sure that this was done by some of our recent MQP students, based on what was written and who was named, and I'm very distressed about that. Our school exists to form faithful Catholic young men and women who love God and respect others, so when something like this happens, it really cuts me to the core and leaves me sad and angry. The lack of respect for people and for property is inexcusable. Our maintenance staff had to spend extra time to figure out how to remove the graffiti and preserve the stone, a waste of their time and the parish's resources. If you know anything about this crime, please contact the Police or me.

There have also been too many incidents of mild vandalism and disrespect for property around our gymnasium, not just during this summer, but all throughout the year. How fortunate we are that we have such fantastic facilities, and I'm grateful to our Athletic Association for all the care they show and the resources they provide. Yet, so many people are in and out of our facilities, and far too often children are unsupervised, so at times we've had to deal with some damage to bathrooms, water fountains, walls, and stairwells. Another problem is that far too many people have keys to our facilities that should not. Keys that are borrowed from the rectory are to be returned to the rectory immediately when an event is completed. Unfortunately, over the years, keys have not been returned, and remarkably, sometimes keys have been copied and kept. The end result is that often people are in our gym or other facilities that are not authorized. This is a safety and a liability issue for the parish that must cease. With the agreement and assistance of the Athletic Association, our gym and other doors will be re-keyed later this summer. The Athletic Association is also looking into some kind of security or camera system, and the Home & School Association and others are looking into some kind of inside fencing to better protect and monitor our facilities, especially the area around the gymnasium.

Again, most of this is regrettable and preventable. Of course I hope and expect that we treat our facilities and anyone's property with great respect, leaving it better than when we found it. Parents, teach this once again to your children, and never leave your children unsupervised when they are at MQP. Parents of our young people, know where your children are, who they are with, and what they are doing.

So many good things are happening with our facilities during these summer months. Our parking lot has been repaired in certain places. The rectory kitchen has been upgraded. Our classrooms and hallways in school are being cleaned and painted. The new campus wi-fi is moving forward. I am proud that our parish does so well staying on top of keeping our facilities top-notch, and I'm grateful to all our parishioners who regularly contribute to the parish so that we can do all these things.
