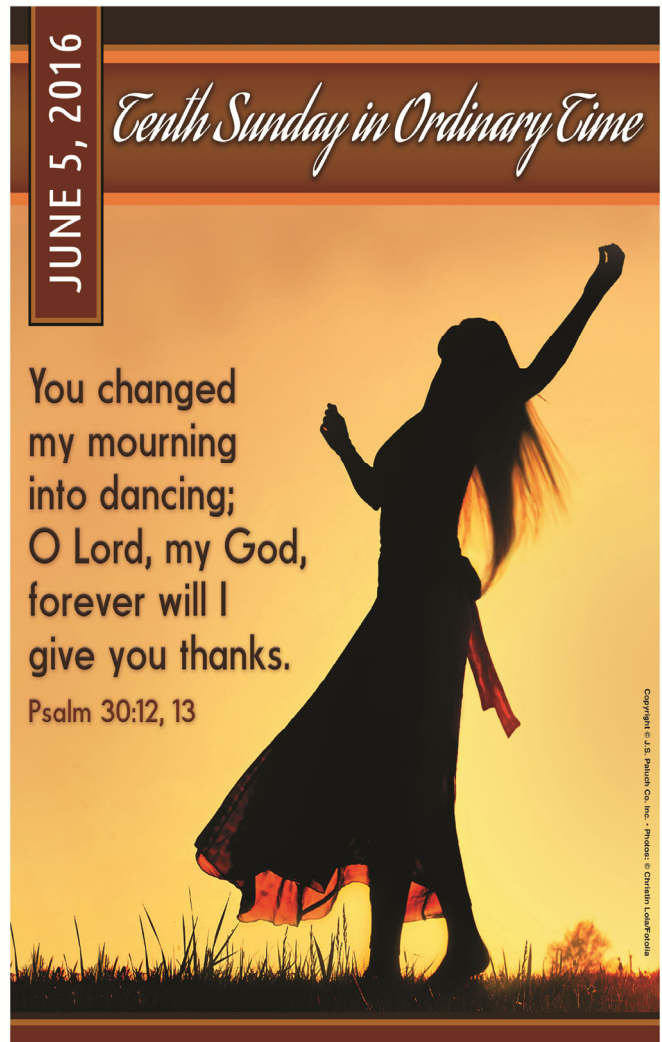

A NEW WEEK — FR. JOHN VIEN

Three cheers for summertime, my favorite time of year! During summer, the warmer weather and more casual attitude means that people often wear shorts and t-shirts in what used to be more formal settings. When I was a boy, I remember women wearing long dresses and men wearing suits to the Mundy, but now no one dresses that way! It used to be that traveling on an airplane was cause for dressing up, but now people prefer to be casual when they travel. Even formal office settings are now more "business casual". Not too many people complain about that; there is nothing wrong with people choosing to be casual, informal, and comfortable in their dress.

But still, many people are alarmed and upset when they see people wearing shorts or sandals or otherwise casual clothes to Mass, and believe me, in my years as a priest, people complain about it. Some people are appalled or upset by this seeming lack of respect for the Eucharist, but others take a "we should just be glad that they are here" approach. At the risk of being accused of not taking a stand, I think that both positions are correct and have merit. Let me explain.

We would never think of going to a wedding reception in shorts and a t-shirt, nor would we wear a suit and tie to the swimming pool. Certain places and certain occasions have certain standards of dress. As the premier expression of our faith, it seems appropriate that we dress with care when we attend Sunday Mass. Wearing what we would otherwise wear on the golf course or the tennis court seems to imply that going to Mass is just another thing we have to do that day on our way to somewhere else. It is not! Sunday Eucharist is our most important weekend obligation! How we dress for Mass says a lot about how much we value, appreciate, and plan for the Eucharist. That said, we must take into account that not everyone has the same taste in clothing! Dress shorts and a golf shirt often look much nicer than blue jeans or the nicest t-shirt, and often teenagers think they are dressed up, while their parents think just the opposite!

And, it is far most important that we attend Mass rather than worrying about what we (or others) are wearing. Once at another parish, I asked an altar server not to wear tennis shoes when he was scheduled to serve Mass. "But Father," he said to me, "these are my nicest shoes!" Lesson learned! We never know if a family just returned from vacation and this is the only Mass they can attend, or if a mother considers it a victory just to get son to Mass despite what he is wearing, or if people have other obligations that prevent them from changing clothes. We must not judge other people or their intentions or their clothing.

So, let me simply say that it would be good for all of us to examine the way we prepare and dress for Mass. If you were invited to a special banquet by the King, you would certainly take the time to dress well and to dress appropriately... and that is what happens every Sunday! At the same time, it would be good for all of us to refrain from judging another about his or her appearance at Mass. Criticizing another in this regard is a sure sign that we have not taken the Lord's command to heart: *Judge not, lest you be judged...* Rather than focusing on others, we should all be more concerned about our own relationship with the Lord.

SUMMER ADORATION INVITATION

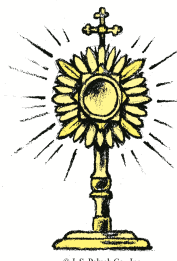

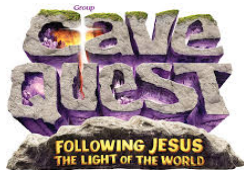
