

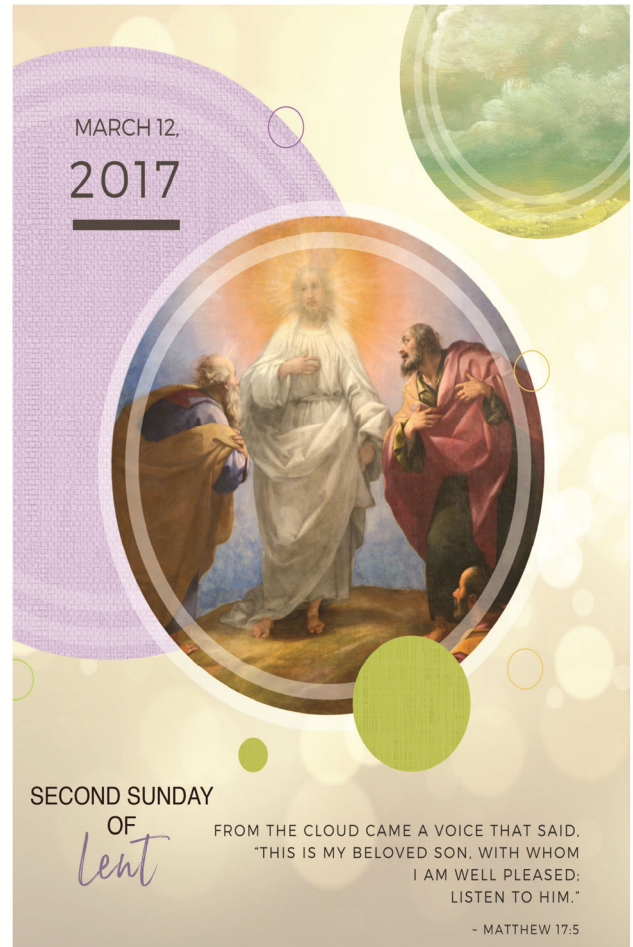

Wishing our MQP family a wonderful Spring Break! Our parish school is closed this week and many of our high schools and other schools are off as well, and many families will be going away (or are already gone!?) for some time away and some time together. So, to all who have some free time this week, enjoy! But remember that time away from school or even time on vacation doesn't mean that we have time away from God or time away from Mass. Every Sunday is a day of obligation, and so I'd always encourage you to make time for Sunday Mass even on vacation. Being away and visiting other Churches and parishes is a wonderful way to experience the diversity of our faith and to grow in appreciation for our family of faith. And if you are out of town this week or next or any weekend, remember that our parish always has bills and salaries to pay, so your continued financial help is critical. If you've not yet enrolled in Online Giving, this is another invitation and request for you to do so. Giving online means that you can go away and your donation will always come to the parish, giving both the donor and the parish some peace of mind. Thanks to all who are faithful attending Mass Sunday and financially supporting the parish Sunday after Sunday!

I'm not going away on vacation for Spring Break, but I will be away from the parish for a few days this week attending the Amazing Parish Conference in Atlanta with members of my Pastor's Leadership Team. The PLT has begun its work, meeting for the first time in a marathon session last Sunday afternoon. Initially, we're getting to know each other, reviewing where we've been, discussing expectations of each other, and learning how to best work together. In Atlanta, we'll meet with hundreds of other Pastors and Parish Leadership Teams from all over the country to learn about how to function effectively as a Team and to learn how we can work together for the good of our parishes. I'm excited and energized by this Team and I'm looking forward to collaborating with them in the years to come as we make MQP an even more amazing parish. As previously announced, the members of the Pastor's Leadership Team are Angela Fiordelisi, Chuck Forthaus, Jim Klimt, Mary Ann Pickering, Steve Schaefer, and Chandra Tripp. Joyce Schaefer is not a formal part of the Team, but is working with me as a coach and with the Team as a consultant as we learn to work together. As they are becoming my trusted advisors, I know that any of the PLT would be happy to hear from you, and know that when you are speaking with them, you are speaking with me. Please pray for this Team and for this parish that we love and serve.

Our search for a new Principal for MQP School has begun in earnest. As the Archdiocesan Catholic Education Office recommends, I have formed a Search Committee to help me review candidates and recommend the best candidate to me. Actually, I was overwhelmed with people who asked to be considered for the Search Committee; dozens of parishioners and others volunteered their time, which I take to be a sign of the great love and care that our parishioners have for MQP School. Our Search Committee includes Tony Armitage, Margaret Kelly, Caroline McCabe, Katy Pavelonis, Barb Schlanger, Maggie Steitz, and Rob Useted. These men and women are parishioners, teachers, parents, School Board members, Parish Council members, and Parish Staff. I know that they will serve us well. Please keep them – and our Principal Search – in your prayers.

Happy St. Patrick's Day to all our parishioners of Irish heritage and all who celebrate this day! More than just a day for parades, beer, and corned beef, this week we celebrate a holy man of God, a bishop, a missionary, and an outstanding teacher of the faith. Let us ask his intercession and prayers. St. Patrick, pray for us!
