

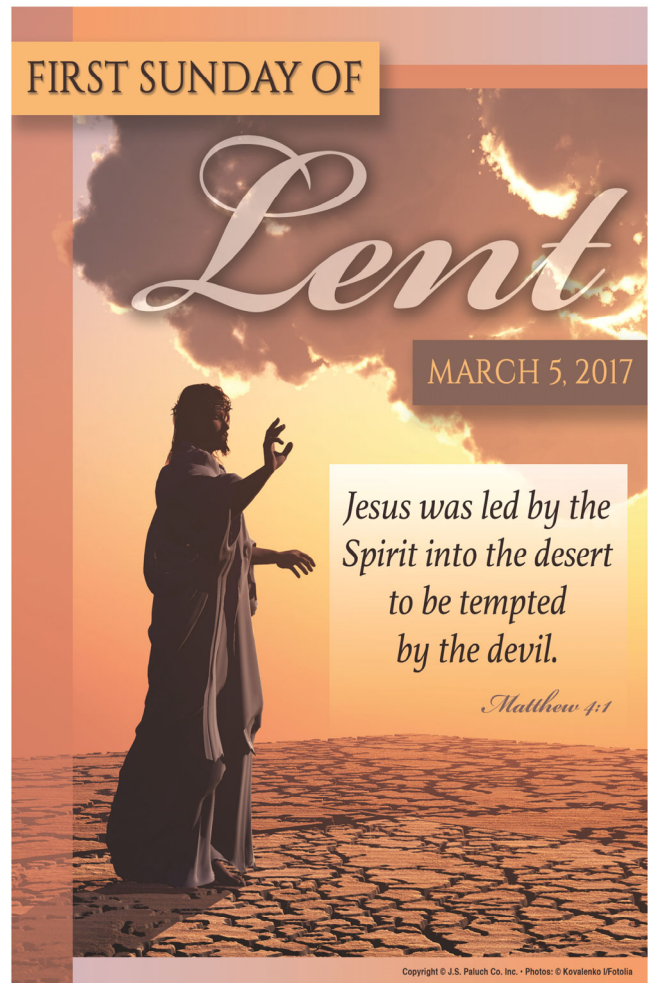

A NEW WEEK — FR. JOHN VIEN

We have begun the journey of Lent. During these holy weeks, we focus on prayer, fasting, and works of mercy so that we can be inwardly cleansed and made ready to celebrate the great mysteries of the Lord's Passion, Death, and Resurrection. Of course I encourage you to consider your own prayer (the time and energy you spend with God), your fasting (what you can give up that you do not need), and your works of mercy (what you can share with or give to others, especially the poor). If each of us makes some strides in each of these areas, it will be a blessed Lent indeed!

I'd like to suggest a resolution for our whole parish family: to attend the Triduum Services of the Lord's Passion, Death, and Resurrection. Plan now to participate in the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, the Passion & Death of the Lord on Good Friday, and the Great Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday. These days are the most important days of our Church year. The Triduum is to our year what Sunday is to our week! If you have attended the Triduum before, you know that they are the most beautiful and meaningful liturgies of the year. If you have not attended before, this is your invitation to take one step closer to the Lord. Set those nights aside, plan now to attend, and make that a Lenten promise.

Lent is a most holy time for our catechumens and candidates who are preparing to receive the Easter Sacraments. Here at MQP, several have been preparing to join our Church this year through prayer, formation, and education. Our catechumens – those who have not been baptized – are Charley Brown and Dana Shopflin; they are preparing to be baptized, confirmed, and to receive the Eucharist at the Easter Vigil. Our candidates – those who have been already baptized in another Christian faith – are Peter Donisanu, Bill Hizar, Eric Jorgensen, and Jake Roesch. They will not be baptized again – since baptism is received only once – but will join the Church by making a Profession of Faith, being confirmed, and receiving the Eucharist. Today we celebrate the Rite of Sending with them at the 9:00am Mass – that is, we are sending them from MQP to the Cathedral, where they will celebrate the Rite of Election and the Call to Continuing Conversion with Archbishop Carlson this Sunday afternoon. During the Sundays to come, our catechumens and candidates will celebrate additional prayers and scrutinies as they prepare for the Easter Sacraments. Our whole parish family should be fervently praying for our catechumens and candidates during these days of Lent, as their conversion and growing closer to the Lord and the community reminds us of our own need for conversion and growth.

Finally, a few have asked about a Parish Lenten project, as we have done in years past. Unfortunately, no one asked or offered something in a timely manner and no one volunteered to coordinate a project. So we will not have a specific Lenten project this year, although charity and works of mercy should be part of the Lenten journey for all of us, so certainly give to those charities that are important to you.

Remember that our own parish is a charity, of course! We're still struggling with making our weekly budget goals and we are still projected to have a deficit at the end of the fiscal year. So your generosity to MQP, especially during Lent, is always appreciated. In addition, our whole parish will be asked to make a sacrificial gift or pledge to *Beyond Sunday*, the Archdiocesan Campaign for our Schools and Parishes, the weekend of April 1-2, so look for information about that in the weeks to come. Also, after Easter, all our parish families will be asked for a gift to the Annual Catholic Appeal. For all these reasons, too, I don't want to ask our parishioners to participate in one more fundraiser. We have many needs on our plate as it is. Thanks for all your generosity to MQP and our endeavors!

May God bless our prayer, fasting, and charity this Lent. Let us pray for one another!

Technology Committee Update

The Mary Queen of Peace Technology Committee, comprised of school staff & parishioners, has been hard at work over the course of this school year. One goal of the committee is to address the need for better technology infrastructure in the school & parish. To that end, we've been assessing our needs, gathering advice, & soliciting bids for planned updates. These updates include the installation of multiple WiFi access points, a new server for the school (already completed), and bringing fiber optic internet service to the school building. Funding for these projects will come from several sources: donations to the Parish Auction Fund-a-Need, the MQP Home & School Association, & E-rate grants. E-rate is a federally funded program that allows schools to apply for partial funding of telecommunications projects. We are working through the E-rate application process & hope to have approval for our project by early spring. Once all is in place, we'll have the benefit of reliable internet service for teachers, students, and parish events! Thanks to all who have supported this project so far with their time, talent & treasure. Please contact the school or parish office if you are interested in making a donation for this project, and look for further updates this spring.

Our Lady of Fatima promises all the Graces necessary for Heaven if a Catholic finishes the Five First Saturdays Devotion. During her July 13, 1925 apparition at Fatima, Our Lady said to Lucia, "I shall come to ask...that on the First Saturday of every month, Communions of reparation be made in atonement for the sins of the world." On December 10, 1925 Our Lady completed her request for the Five First Saturdays and gave her great promise: "...Tell them that I promise to assist at the hour of death with the graces necessary for salvation all those who, in order to make reparation to me, on the First Saturday of 5 successive months, go to confession, receive Holy Communion, say five decades of the Rosary and keep me company for a quarter of an hour, meditating on the fifteen mysteries of the Rosary."

MQP MUSIC NEWS

As we are starting our Lenten journey, I would like to re-emphasize the importance of congregational singing in the Liturgy. God calls us all to lift our voices in song for His glory. The cantors & choirs are there to LEAD you in the singing, not perform for you. Let's use this Lenten season as a vocal "warm-up" towards really lifting our voices in song at Easter time.
