**A NEW WEEK — FR. JOHN VIEN**

Pope Francis was elected Pontiff on March 13, 2013. He has said that “as things got dangerous” in the conclave voting, he was sitting next to his friend, Brazilian Cardinal Claudio Hummes “who comforted me.” When Cardinal Jorge Mario Bergoglio went over the 77 votes needed to become pope, he said Cardinal Hummes “hugged me, kissed me and said, ‘Don’t forget the poor.’” Pope Francis has said that he took to heart the words of his friend and as he considered the name he would take as Pope, and he decided to be called after St. Francis of Assisi, “the man of poverty, the man of peace, the man who loves and protects creation, the same created world with which we don’t have such a good relationship.”

In the 3½ years since Francis has been Pope, he has clearly shown the world that he is also a man of poverty, a man of peace, a man who loves and protects creation. His humility and simplicity are legendary. He calls out world leaders as he encourages and works for peace around the world. And he has brought a new focus to the care of creation through his encyclical “*Laudato Si*” and even by saying that “caring for creation” is a new corporal work of mercy, alongside the ones we all know: feeding the hungry, giving drink to the thirsty, clothing the naked, comforting the sick, assisting the traveler, visiting the imprisoned, and burying the dead.

This week, on Tuesday, October 4, our Church will celebrate the feast of the Saint whose name Pope Francis chose, St. Francis of Assisi. Born in Assisi, Italy, about 1182, Francis was known in his youth for his wealthy upbringing and his drinking and partying. After fighting in a battle between Assisi and Perugia, Francis was captured and imprisoned for ransom. He spent nearly a year in prison – awaiting his father’s payment – and, according to legend, began receiving visions from God. After his release from prison, Francis was praying in the Church of San Damiano when he heard the voice of Christ, who told him to “*Rebuild my Church, which as you can see, is falling into ruin.*” Francis thought that he was literally supposed to rebuild the Church where he was praying and he set off with hammer and nails to make the repairs. Only later did he realize that God was calling him not to rebuild THAT church, but to rebuild THE entire Church. Consequently, he abandoned his life of luxury, embraced a life of poverty and simplicity, and became a devotee of the faith, his reputation spreading all over the Christian world. Many people joined him in his work and ministry, and today, Franciscan priests, brothers, and sisters carry on his legacy and charism. Later in life, Francis reportedly received a vision that left him with the stigmata of Christ – marks resembling the wounds Jesus Christ suffered when he was crucified – making Francis the first person to receive such holy wounds. He died at the young age of 44 in the year 1226. Today, Assisi is a holy place of pilgrimage and peace for Christians all over the world, and St. Francis is one of the most well-known and beloved saints in our Church.

The Feast of St. Francis this week should be the cause of much joy, but also a call to prayer and reflection for us Catholics. For your consideration and prayer: St. Francis was a Deacon (he did not consider himself worthy to be ordained a Priest), so let us pray for all those who serve the Church as Deacons, especially our own Deacon Joe Wientge, who faithfully serves our Parish family. The family of St. Francis includes so many religious men and women who follow in his footsteps, so let us pray for all Franciscan priests and religious and pray for more vocations to their orders. St. Francis is the Patron Saint of Ecology, so let us pray and work for a greater respect and care for our earth, air, and water. St. Francis was a man of peace, so let us pray for peace all over the world, but especially in Syria, the Middle East, and our own cities and communities in the United States. Finally, St. Francis is a Patron of animals, so let us give thanks to God for the gifts of our pets, and for all the animals that help us, entertain us, and feed us. All are welcome, along with their pets, at our Blessing of Animals on the Feast of St. Francis, this Tuesday, October 4, at 6:00pm in front of the Church.
