A NEW WEEK — FR. JOHN VIEN

This week, we are beginning our Stewardship Season here at Mary, Queen of Peace. You should have already received your annual Parish Stewardship Report in the mail, and over the next few weeks, you will be asked to prayerfully consider how you live and practice Stewardship. **Living Stewardship** is actually very simple: it means being **grateful** for and **generous** with the gifts that God has given to you – your time, talent, and treasure.

In the weeks to come, at Mass, parishioners will reflect and share on their own practice of Stewardship, and all our parishioners will be asked to make a new commitment to prayer, participation, and generosity. Our main focus this year is to promote electronic giving. As you have seen in the bulletin and as you will hear me say: our financial outlook is troublesome. We are not meeting our budget goals, we are spending our reserves, and we cannot continue down this path. I will be asking all our parishioners for a more generous financial gift to the parish, and especially encouraging more parishioners to register for and use electronic giving, which is convenient for you and more reliable for the parish. You'll be hearing more about this in the weeks to come, but you are encouraged to sign up to donate electronically at any time via our parish website!

Another part of Stewardship is sharing time and talent. One of the pillars of the Archdiocesan initiative, BeOne, is to "foster a culture of leadership." We certainly need more people to share their time and talent as leaders in our Church and in particular at our parish. I'm asking you today to prayerfully consider stepping up as a leader at MQP by serving on the Parish Council or on my new Pastor's Leadership Team.

The **Parish Council** is seeking three or more new members who will begin a three-year term on January 1, joining the present members who are staying on. The Parish Council is an advisory board to me, serving as the "eyes and ears" of the parish, and especially helping to coordinate and liaison among the various ministries, committees, and organizations in the parish. The Parish Council meets once a month, and members also attend other parish meetings as liaisons. In the pews, you will find nomination forms for you to nominate yourself or another parishioner to serve on the Parish Council. You are asked to return these forms to the rectory or in the collection. All those nominated will be called by Parish Council members to be asked if they would consider serving; those who are interested will be asked to attend an afternoon of discernment to learn about & reflect on the Parish Council, and selections for the Parish Council will be made in December. I value the advice and counsel of our Parish Council and I hope that we will have a robust group of parishioners willing to serve. Please prayerfully consider if God is calling you to this ministry.

I'm also asking parishioners to prayerfully discern if God might be calling you to assist me and serve the parish on a new **Pastor's Leadership Team**. This is a new effort that I am organizing so that I have the support and assistance that I need to be a more effective Pastor for all of you. I am putting together a group of 5-7 parishioners who will be my trusted advisors and sharers in the leadership of the parish. As Pastor, I know that I am the leader of this Parish community, but my expertise is in the spiritual and pastoral side of leadership. There are others who can assist me with strategic planning, finances, personnel, buildings and maintenance, and a host of other issues and I want to tap into some of the great talent and leadership that exists here at MQP. Some of the members of the Pastor's Leadership Team may be staff members, but others certainly will be parishioners with the necessary skills, talents, time, and desire to serve. I hope that this team will be in place by the new year, serving together with me for three years to chart the vision for the parish, and most importantly, to make that vision a reality! We'll meet at least weekly, initially for the first six months or so to get to know one another and our style and focus, for a good two years to accomplish some major goals for our parish, and for the final months to consider the transition to another group or another form of parish leadership. I know that there have been so many studies and surveys of MQP over the past years, but now is the time to move forward, do the difficult but important work, and to make MQP an amazing parish! For those who will serve on the Pastor's Leadership Team, it will be a major commitment of time and energy, but also a great opportunity for them to step up, join me, and help to make a difference in our parish. So much more detail about the Pastor's Leadership Team can be found on the Pastor's page of our parish website. Please check it out if you would like more information, and especially if you would like to nominate yourself to serve on the Pastor's Leadership Team. Two informational sessions about the Pastor's Leadership Team are upcoming: next Sunday, October 30, at 12:30pm and Monday, November 7, at 7pm. Please come if you are interested in serving or if you are curious about this new Leadership Team, and if you would like to know more, please be in touch with me. You will be hearing much more about this in the weeks and months to come.

Please join me in praying for our parish these days. Let us pray that we will have a greater commitment to Living Stewardship, that we will have all the financial resources we need to continue our work and ministry, and that God will raise up leaders to serve on our Parish Council and new Pastor's Leadership Team.
Mary, Queen of Peace, pray for us!




DO CATHOLIC SCHOOLS MATTER?

A 2014 survey of parents conducted by the Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate (CARA) at Georgetown Univ. revealed that the top reason parents chose to enroll children in Catholic schools is not for academics but for 'quality religious education' followed by a 'safe environment'. If fewer and fewer Catholics enroll in Catholic schools in the future either because of changing preferences or a lack of schools, it will become ever more challenging for the Catholic Church to foster vocations to the priesthood and religious life. The connection between Catholic schooling and interest in vocations is found to be robust and statistically significant even after controlling for a variety of other factors (e.g., enrollment in parish-based religious education, frequency of Mass attendance, race and ethnicity, income, other youth experiences.) In the broadest view, the long-term benefits of Catholic schools include making Mass attendance more likely and helping ensure young Catholics are confirmed (and remain Catholic as adults), along with the importance these institutions play in fostering Catholic leaders. The Catholic Church would be weakened significantly by continued losses of Catholic schools.

COLLECTION FOR HAITI

While many in Cuba and in the USA were affected by Hurricane Matthew, Haiti, the poorest nation in the Western hemisphere, experienced the most devastation, with nearly 1000 people killed & tens of thousands left homeless.
