A NEW WEEK — FR. JOHN VIEN

As announced last weekend in my homily and in my weekly column, I'm excited to form a new leadership model for MQP called the "Pastor's Leadership Team" or "PLT", a volunteer leadership team of parish leaders to collaborate with me to set the vision and strategic direction for our parish, complete with necessary priorities, resources, and timelines. Since this is something new, naturally you may have some questions...

Why do we need this?

MQP has and continues to accomplish great things for our Lord and for our community as evidenced in our past successes. As a part of Christ's Church and as a parish, we are constantly in need of renewal. This is an opportunity to better align our parish with the church's mission and the signs of the times so that we can move forward in faith, be more relevant in our community, and be even more effective in our mission to evangelize and spread the Good News.

What will this look like?

The Pastor's Leadership Team will be comprised of 5-7 selected parish leaders, serving a concurrent three-year term. They will assist me in shouldering the responsibility of leading the parish; collaborate with me in matters of organization and operations, Pastoral planning and goal setting; and enable me to be the spiritual shepherd of the parish in matters of faith. The Leadership Team members will be the ones with whom I can share responsibility for leading the parish at the highest level, a group of trusted advisors with the faith, maturity, and the vision to lead the parish forward. They are not necessarily Parish Staff or Parish Council members.

How will the Team operate?

Once the team is created, we will be following the **Amazing Parish** approach to ensure success in the various phases of the Leadership Team's development and responsibilities. We are also aligning with the St. Louis Archdiocesan **beONE** framework leadership pillar called "embracing a culture of leadership." I am in no way, shape, or form relinquishing the Pastoring or leading of this parish family; I'm simply asking for strong leaders to assist me in moving this parish forward in faith so that we can become an even more Amazing Parish.

What next?

I'd like to invite our entire parish to check out www.amazingparish.org. This great parish support organization will be my guide moving forward. I know that this Parish has so many capable leaders ready and willing to step up, and I'm counting on you! Friends, please pray for the success of my Pastor's Leadership Team, and for our own Amazing Parish.

- I'd be remiss if I did not note that we are entering into some holy Catholic days! Hallowe'en really is All Hallow's Eve, the beginning of the days when we Catholics honor All the Saints and All the Souls. To all who are trick-or-treating, have fun and be safe! And be sure to come to Mass on Tuesday, All Saints Day, a holy day of obligation. I'd encourage everyone to come to Mass also this Wednesday, All Souls Day, when we remember and pray for our beloved dead. In addition to the morning Masses, there is a 7:00pm Mass on All Saints Day and on All Souls Day. Please join us!
- And, as if we could forget, Election Day is nearly upon us. We have been saturated with ads and sound bites, but please do not forget to turn to God in prayer in the days ahead: not only asking God to guide and direct our choices at the ballot, but to pray for all candidates, and to pray especially for the healing of our nation when the election is finished:

Lord God, as the election approaches, we seek to better understand the issues and concerns that confront our city, state, and country, and how the Gospel compels us to respond as faithful citizens in our community. We ask for eyes that are free from blindness so that we might see each other as brothers and sisters, one and equal in dignity, especially those who are victims of abuse and violence, deceit and poverty. We ask for ears that will hear the cries of children unborn and those abandoned, men and women oppressed because of race or creed, religion or gender. We ask for minds and hearts that are open to hearing the voices of leaders who will bring us closer to your kingdom. We pray for discernment so that we may choose leaders who hear your Word, live your love, and keep in the ways of your truth as they follow the example of Jesus and his Apostles and guide us into your kingdom of justice and peace. We ask all this in the name of Jesus, your Son!




DO CATHOLIC SCHOOLS MATTER?

A 2014 survey of parents conducted by the Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate (CARA) at Georgetown Univ. revealed that the top reason parents chose to enroll children in Catholic schools is not for academics but for 'quality religious education' followed by a 'safe environment'. If fewer and fewer Catholics enroll in Catholic schools in the future either because of changing preferences or a lack of schools, it will become ever more challenging for the Catholic Church to foster vocations to the priesthood and religious life. The connection between Catholic schooling and interest in vocations is found to be robust and statistically significant even after controlling for a variety of other factors (e.g., enrollment in parish-based religious education, frequency of Mass attendance, race and ethnicity, income, other youth experiences.) In the broadest view, the long-term benefits of Catholic schools include making Mass attendance more likely and helping ensure young Catholics are confirmed (and remain Catholic as adults), along with the importance these institutions play in fostering Catholic leaders. The Catholic Church would be weakened significantly by continued losses of Catholic schools.


Online Giving

ALL SAINTS DAY

Tuesday, November 1, is the Feast of All Saints, a holy day of obligation. Masses for the holy day will be celebrated in Church at 6:45am, 8:00am, and 7:00pm. The school and parish offices will be closed on All Saints Day. If you have parish business, please take care of that on another day.



ALL SOULS DAY

Wednesday, November 2, is All Souls Day, when we remember and pray for our beloved dead. Masses for All Souls will be celebrated at 6:45am, 8:00am, 9:15am (with our school children), and 7:00pm. The evening Mass on All Souls Day is our annual Mass of Remembrance, when we especially pray for our parishioners & all those who died in this last year; all are invited, especially if you're grieving the recent death of a loved one. A reception in the Msgr. Lubeley Room will follow the Mass.

During November, you are invited to bring a picture of your departed family members or friends and place those on the side altars of the Blessed Mother & St. Joseph. Also, the Book of the Names of the Dead will be at the St. Joseph altar; feel free to write the names of your departed family members and friends there so we can remember them in prayer during November.

COLLECTION FOR HAITI

While many in Cuba and in the USA were affected by Hurricane Matthew, Haiti, the poorest nation in the Western hemisphere, experienced the most devastation, with nearly 1000 people killed & tens of thousands left homeless. Once again, Archbishop Carlson has asked the people of the Archdiocese of St. Louis to step up to help our brothers and sisters suffering in the wake of a terrible natural disaster. A second collection for Haiti will take place at all the Masses this weekend, October 29-30. The monies collected will be given to Catholic Relief Services to assist in their efforts to aid & rebuild Haiti.
