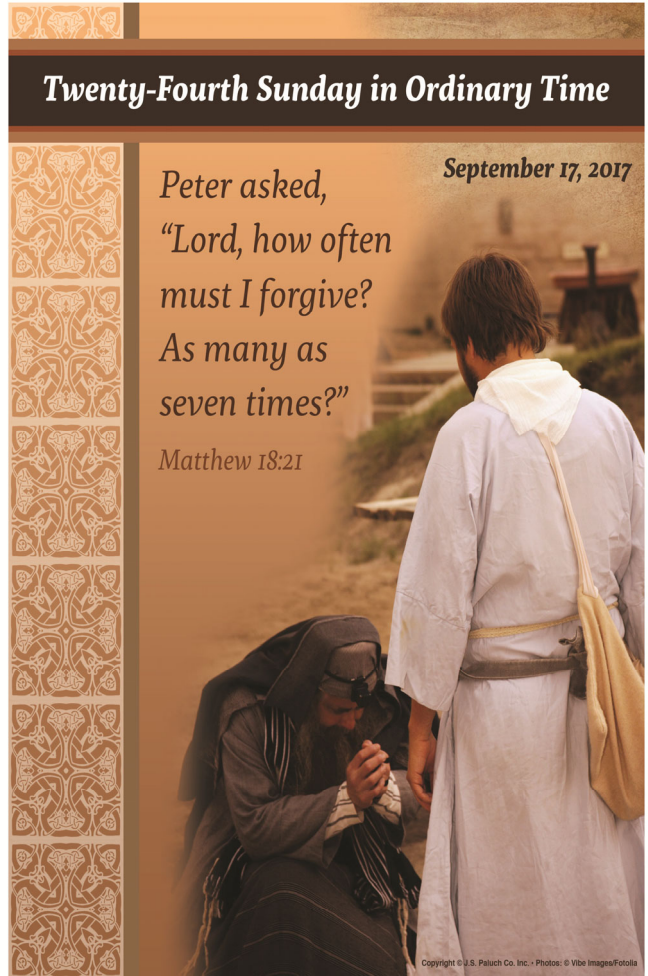

A NEW WEEK — FR. JOHN VIEN

I want our parish community to be marked by radical hospitality, that is, that we know and welcome and love all people who come to MQP. At some of the Masses I've celebrated recently, I've invited the assembly to greet and meet one another. If we don't know one another, we can't love one another, and if we don't love one another, then we're not being faithful to the command of Christ. Many have heard me joke (or am I serious?) that I know by now where most people sit in Church. We are all, after all, creatures of habit. But, I propose that changing where you sit at Mass might help to strengthen our community and promote hospitality. And so, I offer, for your consideration, seven reasons why you should sit in a different spot at Church next Sunday. Ready?

- Most of us get too comfortable at church in general.** We develop all kinds of habits, like parking in the same area, going in the same door, sitting in the same place, and often going to the same restaurants after Mass. Nothing changes – including, frankly, the depth of our walk with God. We also don't expect God to do anything different when we gather, and we then get what we expected.
- You'll get to know different people.** Sitting among different people will give you opportunity to know somebody new or to get to know someone more deeply. You'll appreciate better the Body of Christ in the diversity of its members.
- You'll see and hear the Mass differently.** It's strange, actually, how changing your seat alters your perspective on the Mass. You look at the presider from a different vantage point. You hear the music and the singing differently. You notice things about the building you had never seen before. You'll often even listen to the homily differently, simply because everything feels new (and, if you think I'm crazy here, at least try it...).
- Your children will learn to participate more in the Mass.** Many parents and families sit in the back of the Church. I understand that people want easy access to the cry room and the doors of Church when children are young, but as they get older, it's better for them to be near the front, where they can see the action of the Mass and learn to participate. Remember that your children are smaller than you, and in the back they are usually staring at people's backsides. If you and your kids have been sitting in the back of Church for a while, it's time to move up front!
- Somebody else might need your current seat.** For example, too many people sit toward the back of the Church, forcing latecomers and guests to walk to the front. That's not the most loving or wise way to welcome these folks to the service. Why don't you sit toward the front next week and free up space for others? Also, too many folks sit on the end of a pew, blocking others from entering and sending the subtle message "Don't sit by me!" How about moving to the inside of the pew?
- You'll learn to be more comfortable with change in general.** Here's a crazy suggestion: sit in a different place *every week*. Don't let yourself get stagnant in your approach to Mass, beginning with the simple decision of where you sit. Change your place each week, and you'll likely be more open to change as our parish moves forward in the future.
- If you completely refuse to change, you might reveal a negative side of your heart.** I understand there are reasons to sit in a particular place (eg: for access to hearing devices, seating for the disabled, etc.), but most of us have little reason not to change – except for laziness or stubbornness. If that's your reason for not even considering this suggestion, you may need to check your heart.

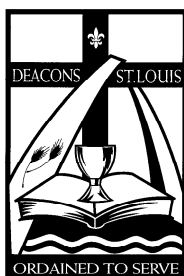

Catechesis of the Good Shepard

CGS, or Catechesis of the Good Shepherd, is a program that began back in the 1950's by Sofia Cavalletti and her colleague Gianna Gobbi in Rome. CGS is a Montessori based program that allows the children to foster their relationship with God directed by the Spirit of God within the child in their own space (the Atrium) with assistance from an adult (the trained Catechist).

Mary Queen of Peace has an Atrium located across from the cafeteria in the day school that now offers CGS to its 3-year-old preschoolers all the way up to its 3rd graders this year! The program began in the day school back in 2013 in the pre-K class with Level 1 and has evolved to now include those children in pre-3 preschool thru Kindergarten. Level 2 was introduced in 2015 to its 1st & 2nd graders and this year it will extend thru to the 3rd-grade class! In the meantime, if you have a child in any of the above mentioned grades, be sure to visit our Atrium at the Back-to-School Night on August 30 for the Pre-school thru 4th grade night!
