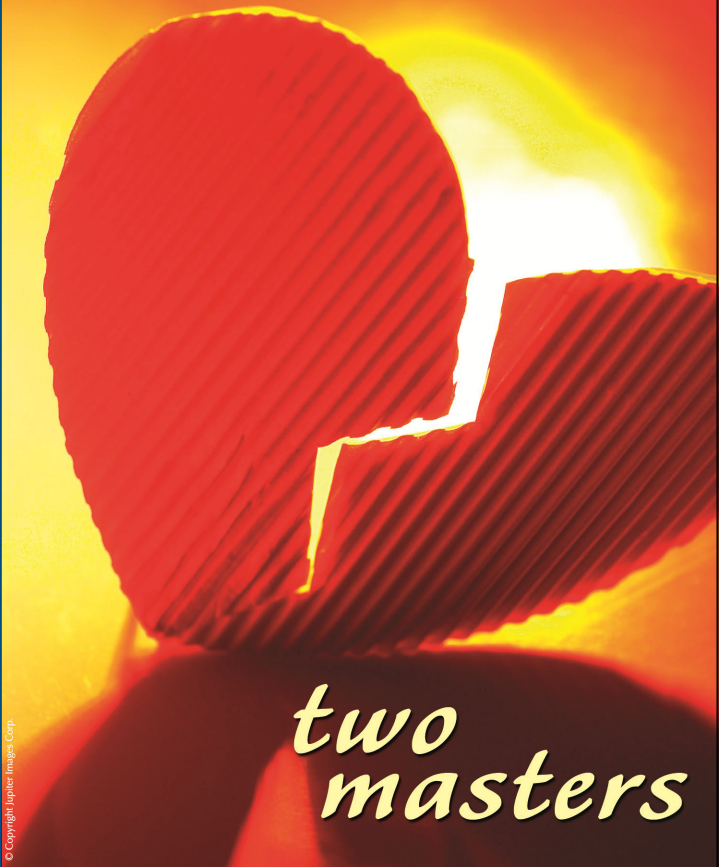

**A NEW WEEK — FR. JOHN VIEN**

Sometimes it seems that we are living in an age that has lost its way. The current Presidential Campaign has reached new lows as the candidates trade insults and invectives. The comments sections on the web only seem to encourage people to make anonymous comments that are mean and snarky. These days, with text and email the preferred method of communication, it's so easy for messages to be misinterpreted & feelings to be hurt. And every generation thinks that children "these days" don't have the manners that they once had.

Kindness may seem like a small thing, but it is such an important thing! If you've been paying attention, you've heard me talk about this in homilies, at parish meetings, as well as with our schoolteachers and councils and organizations. There's a lot more to being Christian than being kind, but here's the bottom line: if we are not kind, we are not Christian. Unfortunately, as I've come to know MQP, I've heard about and witnessed some behaviors and heard some comments that are less than kind. That's why I've undertaken my own informal "Campaign of Kindness" here at MQP. Yes, the vast majority of contacts and interactions and people that I see here are good and holy and charitable and kind, but even a few unkind remarks or uncharitable actions are too many, wouldn't you agree?

I'm happy that our Athletic Association has gotten onboard with my "Campaign of Kindness". As the new athletic year begins, all parents and coaches received a communication last week that we will have a "zero tolerance" policy for uncharitable comments or actions at our parish sports events. It reads in part:

*Welcome to another year of MQP Sports! We are excited to open up the 2016-2017 regular season this weekend with both Soccer & Volleyball. Before we begin, the Athletic Association, along with our Pastor, Father John Vien, wants to encourage every Parent and Coach to be a positive role model for each child during every sporting activity we participate in this year.*

*In this spirit, we ask that you do not engage the referees in any conversation during the game. The coach is allowed to politely interact with officials... However, complaining to the officials or "working the ref" will not be tolerated by any Parent or Coach. Please keep in mind that many of the Referees are MQP Students or very recent MQP alumni who have never done this before. Like anyone learning a new skill, you should expect they will make mistakes. You should even expect them to make mistakes that could affect the outcome of games. Nevertheless, we consider these officials as much a part of our athletic program as the players and coaches. Falling into the habit of criticizing officials keeps our players from experiencing and dealing with failure and defeat, which is an important part of sportsmanship. **"By providing these healthy, character building activities and programs, we hope to enable youth and young adults to realize their destiny as followers of Jesus Christ"** (Taken from the CYC Mission Statement).*

*Our Pastor, Fr. John Vien, certainly wants and expects our parents to be Christian role models and our sports programs to be places where our children can experience a kind and charitable Christian atmosphere. Therefore, MQP has a zero tolerance policy for arguing with Referees, Opposing Coaches, or Parents:*

*1st Incident: Meeting with Father John and a Member of the Athletic Association*

*2nd Incident: Ban from that sport for the balance of the season for games and practices*

*For the most part (98% percent of the time), Parents and Coaches are excellent role models and we expect that to continue and for there to be no problems at all, but even a handful of incidents is too many. Remember, we strive not to be an average athletic program. We strive to be the most sportsmanlike, friendly, welcoming program in the community. We are gathered together to represent our parish, our school, and our faith and our behavior should obviously reflect that representation. However, we needed to institute some standard policy for negative behavior. Let's all keep in mind that this is CYC, this is our chance to behave as Christians to everyone around us.*

Thanks to our Athletic Association for getting behind my "Campaign of Kindness"! Little by little, we will make a difference!
