A NEW WEEK — FR. JOHN VIEN

For many folks, Labor Day means two things: a day off work and the end of summer. But we cannot fail to remember that Labor Day is a day set aside to honor all working men and women. Back in the 1880's a man by the name of Peter McGuire, who helped found the carpenters' union, suggested at a union meeting that a day be set aside to recognize the contributions of laborers and to acknowledge the role that unions had played in helping workers achieve better pay and better working conditions. During the Industrial Revolution of the 1800's, the United States of America, and many other world economies, moved from being based on the farm to based on the factory. But it took a while for humane working conditions to catch up with the economy. At that time, workers often labored 16 hours a day in unsafe conditions for wages that were so low that many children had to work to help their families survive. Peter McGuire envisioned a day when workers could call attention to their grievances, and the first Labor Day was celebrated in New York City in 1882.

This Labor Day weekend gives us all the opportunity once again to reflect on the dignity of labor; that's certainly part of the Catholic Tradition, too. Over 100 years ago, Pope Leo XIII became the first pope to address the dignity of human work and human workers in his famous encyclical *Rerum Novarum* (which is Latin for "Of New Things"). You see, at that time, in the 19th century, it was a new thing to pay a just wage for a fair day's work. It was a new thinking that all people deserve safe working environments. It was a new thinking that the economy must serve people, and not the other way around. And it was a new thinking that work was more than just a way to make a living; it is a form in our continuing participation in God's creation that can lead us to salvation.

That is why, to this day, our Catholic Church always stands up in support of workers, unions, the unemployed, and all who seek to enhance human dignity. So, this weekend, we Catholics join all Americans in remembering and celebrating the contributions that workers have made to our nation and to our Church. On Labor Day, Monday, September 5, there will be one Mass at 8:00am. There is no 6:45am Mass, there is no Adoration or Benediction, and the Parish Offices and School are closed. Enjoy the day with your family and friends!

A few noteworthy things will happen in the weeks to come:

At the 9:00am Mass next Sunday, September 11, our Confirmation Class will be enrolled and commissioned. This year, our 8th Graders are participating in a new Confirmation program called Decision Point, from the Dynamic Catholic Organization, and I am very pleased with its catechetical content and its emphasis on an ongoing relationship with Jesus and with the Church. I know that our 8th Graders will be well prepared for the Sacrament of Confirmation when Archbishop Carlson comes to MQP next March 23, 2017. Please pray for our Confirmation candidates.

At the 11:00am Mass on Sunday, September 18, we will join the Church in the United States celebrating Catechetical Sunday. We will recognize and commission all those who are catechists for our parish, those who lead and form our Adults in Faith Formation, and those who serve our children in the School and PSR. I've invited all the leaders of our Adult Faith Formation activities, as well as our school teachers and PSR catechists, to come to this Mass for a blessing. Through their ministry, may many adults and children grow in their faith in this year to come!

Finally, you have recently been introduced to Philip Rathinam, a seminarian who is living and ministering at MQP during this coming year. I'd also ask you to welcome two other seminarians who will be with us on Sunday mornings and teaching in our PSR on Tuesday evenings. T.J. Bauer, from the Archdiocese of St. Louis, and Padraic Stack, from the Archdiocese of Omaha, are both third-year theologians at Kenrick-Glennon Seminary, and will be with us this year as part of their Pastoral Formation. Please offer them a warm welcome and keep them in your prayers as they prepare for Ordination to the Diaconate and Priesthood.

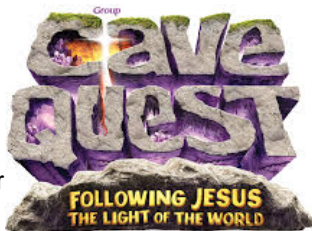
